

Chapter Bylaws
Of the
St. Mark's Episcopal School Chapter
Of the
National Junior Honor Society

Adopted: *5/14/15*

Revised: *3/10/16*

ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this chapter shall be the St. Mark's Episcopal School Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society.

ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this chapter shall be to create an enthusiasm for scholarship, to stimulate a desire to render service, to promote worthy leadership, and to encourage the development of character in students of St. Mark's Episcopal School.

ARTICLE III: POWERS

Section 1: This chapter operates under the direction of and in full compliance with the National Constitution of NJHS. See www.nhs.us/constitutions.

Section 2: The chapter adviser is given the authority to supervise the administration of chapter activities, as delegated by the Headmaster .

Section 3: Final authority on all activities and decisions of the chapter resides with the Headmaster.

Section 4: Non-discrimination. This chapter of NJHS maintains policies and practices that are designed to prevent discrimination against any qualified candidate or member on the basis of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex (gender), and disability. This policy of nondiscrimination applies to all practices, including the chapter administration and the selection, discipline, and dismissal of members.

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: Membership in this chapter is an honor bestowed upon deserving students by the faculty and shall be based on the criteria of Scholarship, Service, Leadership, Character, and Citizenship.

Section 2: Membership in this chapter shall be known as active and graduate. Active members become graduate members at graduation. Graduate members have no voice or vote in chapter affairs.

Section 3: Eligibility:

- a. Candidates eligible for selection to this chapter must be members of the 6th, 7th or 8th grade.
- b. To be eligible for selection to membership in this chapter, the candidate must have been enrolled for a period equivalent to two trimesters at St. Mark's Episcopal School.
- c. Candidates eligible for election to the chapter shall have a minimum cumulative overall average of 90 at the time of application (current school year, end of second trimester).
- d. Upon meeting the grade level, enrollment, and grade average standards, candidates shall then be considered based on their service, leadership, character, and citizenship.

ARTICLE V: SELECTION OF MEMBERS

Section 1: The selection of members to this chapter shall be by a majority vote of the Faculty Council which consists of five faculty members appointed by the Headmaster. The chapter adviser shall be the sixth, non-voting, ex-officio member of the Faculty Council.

Section 2: The selection of active members shall be held once a year following the second trimester of the school year.

Section 3: Prior to the final selection, the following shall occur:

- a. Students' academic and conduct records shall be reviewed to determine scholastic eligibility.
- b. Students who are eligible scholastically (i.e. candidates) shall be notified and asked to complete and submit the Candidate Packet for further consideration.
- c. Middle School faculty may be requested to evaluate candidates determined to be scholastically eligible using the Teacher Evaluation Form provided by the advisor.
- d. The Faculty Council shall review the Candidate Forms, Narrative Essays, and other relevant information to determine those who fully meet the selection criteria for membership.

Section 4: Candidates become members when inducted at a special Induction Ceremony.

Section 5: An active member of the National Junior Honor Society who transfers from this school will be given an official letter indicating the status of his/her membership.

Section 6: An active member of the National Junior Honor Society who transfers to this school will be automatically accepted for membership in this chapter. The Faculty Council shall grant to the transferring member one trimester to complete the requirements of

membership and, thereafter, this member must maintain those requirements for this chapter in order to retain his/her membership.

ARTICLE VI: OBLIGATION OF MEMBERS

Section 1: The St. Mark's Episcopal School Chapter of the National Junior Honor Society does not charge dues.

Section 2: Each member of this chapter who is in good standing with regard to the membership standards and member obligations shall be entitled to wear the emblem adopted by the National Junior Honor Society.

Section 3: Any member who withdraws, resigns, or is dismissed from the chapter shall return the emblem to the chapter.

ARTICLE VII: OFFICERS

Section 1: The officers of the chapter shall be president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer.

Section 2: Student officers shall be elected at the second meeting of each school year. All returning members in good standing with the chapter are eligible to run for a position as an officer. However, for the office of President, only 8th graders who have been a member for a full school year are eligible. Any active member can nominate an eligible member as a candidate for office.

Section 3: Voting shall be by secret ballot. A majority vote shall be necessary to elect any officer of this chapter. If the first vote does not yield a majority, a second vote shall be taken of the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes.

Section 4: It shall be the duty of the president to preside at the meetings of the chapter, and serve as the official representative of the chapter at school and community functions.

Section 5: The vice-president shall preside in the absence of the president and shall also keep a record of members' contributions to leadership and service.

Section 6: The secretary shall keep the minutes and attendance records for meetings and be responsible for all official correspondence.

Section 7: The treasurer shall keep the record of business expenses, dues, and all other financial transactions of the chapter.

Section 8: Officers and the faculty adviser(s) shall collectively be known as the chapter's Executive Committee. The executive committee shall establish annual goals for the chapter

and have general charge of the meetings and the business of the chapter, but any action by the executive committee is subject to the review of the chapter members.

ARTICLE VIII: MEETINGS

Section 1: Regular meetings of this chapter shall be monthly during lunch. Special meetings can be called by the president with approval of the adviser.

Section 2: This chapter shall conduct its meetings according to *Robert's Rule of Order*.

Section 3: Members are expected to attend all chapter meetings.

ARTICLE IX: ACTIVITIES

Section 1: The chapter shall determine one or more service projects for each year.

Section 2: All members shall regularly participate in these projects.

Section 3: These projects shall have the following characteristics: fulfill a need within the school or community, have the support of the administration and the faculty, be appropriate educationally defensible, and be well-planned, organized, and executed.

Section 4: Each member shall have the responsibility for choosing and participating in an individual service project which reflects his or her particular talents and interests and as approved by the chapter adviser. This individual project is in addition to the chapter projects to which all members contribute. Each member should accumulate and submit record showing that he/she contributed a minimum of ten hours of service to the individual project. This record is due to the chapter adviser before the close of school each May.

Section 5: The chapter shall publicize and promote its projects in a positive manner.

ARTICLE X: DISCIPLINE and DISMISSAL of MEMBERS

Section 1: Any member who falls below the standards of scholarship, service, leadership, character, or citizenship may be considered for discipline or dismissal from the St. Mark's chapter of the National Junior Honor Society. A member of the National Junior Honor Society is expected to maintain his/her academic standing and take an active role in service and leadership to his/her school and community.

Section 2: If a member's overall cumulative grade average falls below a 90 or if he/she receives a grade lower than a 80 on a report card, he/she may be given a written warning and a reasonable time period for improvement upon recommendation of the Faculty

Council and approval by the Headmaster. If the overall cumulative grade average remains below standard at the end of the warning period, the student may be subject to further disciplinary action upon recommendation of the Faculty Council and approval by the Headmaster that includes consideration of dismissal from the chapter.

Section 3: Violations of the law or school regulations can result in immediate consideration of the dismissal of a member (see section 5 below). These violations include, but are not limited to DWI, stealing, destruction of property, cheating, truancy, or possession, selling, or being under the influence of drugs or alcohol at school or school-related activities or in the community.

Section 4: A member's conduct grades must all be S's (satisfactory) or O's (outstanding) to remain in good standing. If a member receives an N or lower on their report card, he/she will be given one trimester to bring their conduct grades back up to S or O. Offenders of the school honor code (such as use of profanity, failure to comply, unexcused absences, excessive tardiness, etc.) may receive written warning notification by the Faculty Council. A conference may be requested by either party (Faculty Council or student/parent). If the member is involved in another violation of the school honor code, the member may be considered for dismissal.

Section 5: Chapter officers, as representatives of the chapter, can be removed from their positions as a consequence of disciplinary action taken by the Faculty Council.

Section 6: In all cases of pending dismissal:

The member will receive written notification from the Adviser/Faculty Council indicating the reason for consideration of dismissal.

The member will be given the opportunity to respond to the charge(s) against him/her at a hearing before the Faculty Council prior to any vote on dismissal (in accordance with due process identified in Article X of the National Constitution). The member will have the opportunity to present his/her defense either in person or via a written statement presented in lieu of the face-to-face hearing. Following the hearing, the Faculty Council will then vote on whether to dismiss. A majority vote of the Faculty Council is needed to dismiss any member.

The results of the Faculty Council vote will be presented to the Headmaster for review, and then stated in a letter sent to the student and parents. Dismissed members must surrender any membership emblems to the adviser.

The Faculty Council's decision may be appealed to the Headmaster according to provisions of the school's discipline policies.

A member who is dismissed or resigns, may never again be considered for membership in the National Junior Honor Society.

Section 7: In lieu of dismissal, the Faculty Council may impose disciplinary sanctions upon a member as deemed appropriate.

ARTICLE XI: RATIFICATION, APPROVAL, and REVIEW




Section 1: These bylaws will be approved upon receiving a two-thirds affirmative vote of all active members of the chapter, a majority affirmative vote of the Faculty Council, and approval by the Headmaster.

Section 2: These bylaws shall be reviewed and if necessary, revised within five years from the date of approval noted on this document.

ARTICLE XII: AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the chapter, provided notice of the proposed amendment has been given to members at least one month prior to the vote. The exceptions being Articles V and X, which are developed by the Faculty Council with the approval of the Headmaster.
